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KEY FIGURES

The health of rural Karnataka children

During these last five years, India performed a strong economic growth enabling a decrease of the number of people living below the poverty level. Nevertheless, the extreme poverty and the malnutrition remain. The disparities between urban and rural areas, cities and countryside remain important impacting currently on health and educational childhood problems. A recent UNICEF report (« The State of the World's Children ») declares that the rural infant mortality ratio of 63 deaths per 1000 living births is still problematic ; mostly occurring in the very first few months.

Furthermore, many children, from 1 to 5 years, are suffering from malnutrition deficiencies due to environment insufficient hygienic conditions, generating infectious risks and currently die of preventable diseases (measles, tuberculosis, hepatitis, etc,...), including respiratory infections and childhood diarrhea due to non-drinkable water and lack of hygiene due also to mothers' limited education, remaining major risk factors. The report also indicates that 46 % of 1 to 3 years old children are undersized, 47 % are underweight and 75 % are severely anemic.

Referring to these statistics, FIK strong commitment aims at developing daily sufficient hygienic and sanitary conditions with health care access for mothers and their children. Today, the pediatric camps organized by **Doctor Vasant Gojnur** and his team offer days of medical consultations for Halligudi's children providing medicines for free.

Subsequently, with the nursery installation, the medical follow-up adapted to individualized educational processes will be implemented referring to **Maria Montessori** pedagogy and **Pierre Rabhi** method, consisting in various manual activities, like gardening, and early learning musical and artistic education noticed to be as important as intellectual learning in childhood development.

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The Ayurvedic indian medicine practiced in Halligudi

The Ayurvedic medicine was created in India approximately 5000 years ago. In Sanskrit (indian language inherited from Antiquity and considered to be the most flourishing literature in the world), the word "ayurveda " is a combination of two words " ayur ", which means " life " and " veda ", which means " science "; Ayurveda is meaning "science of life ". Considered as a complete care system, Ayurveda concern both, spirit and body.

From ancient time, this Medicine has been remaining the health care fundamental basis system in India. Even now Indians are very attached to it, consisting in several practices easily included their daily living (diet, plants and minerals formulated remedies, respiratory exercises, Yoga practice, meditation, etc,...), Ayurveda is considered to be complementary to modern Medecine. Halligudi's medical staff and specialists are providing these ancestral health care approaches to Halligudi's inhabitants and surroundings.
